

To bless is to be blessed – not in the sense that we are earning merit or assuaging guilt, but that we are able to celebrate the good fortune of others and to bask in their joy. To be blessed is to realize that "in the image of God" includes Miss Magdalena and Miss Alice. To be blessed is to experience the unity of the Body of Christ, as Presbyterian and Methodist and Baptist together serve Christ by serving "the least of these." To be blessed is to end the day tired and sore, and be able to say, "God, that feels good!" Amen.

Pig Roasts and Potlucks

Spinach Salad with Goat Cheese and Walnuts

Ingredients:

Dressing: * 1 tablespoon red wine vinegar

- * 1 tablespoon minced shallot or red onion
- * 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- * 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- * Freshly ground black pepper
- * 3 tablespoons quality walnut oil
- * 8 cups baby spinach leaves, stems trimmed, washed, and dried
 - * 1/2 cup whole or chopped toasted walnuts
 - * 1/3 cup crumbled goat cheese

Directions:

Salad:

In a small bowl, combine the vinegar, shallot, mustard, salt, and pepper. Gradually whisk in the oil to make a creamy dressing. Put all but a large handful of the spinach in a large bowl. Toss with most of the dressing. Add remaining spinach and continue tossing until well coated.

Serve immediately topped with goat cheese and walnuts...





CHOIR COLLABORATION CONCERT



April 17th and 18th, Valmont choir participated in its first ever choir collaboration! Along with the choirs from First United Methodist Church in Lafayette and Risen Savior Lutheran Church in Broomfield, Valmont prepared, rehearsed and performed a concert featuring each choir individually as well as combined. In addition to rehearsing with these groups, Valmont choir took part in a clinic held by Dr. Bonnie Draina on body mapping, awareness and expression. The research behind body mapping states that if a person perceives their body in a certain way, their body will behave as if it is so. An example we learned from the clinic was that if a person believes that their jaw joints are located behind their ears, their brain

will tell their jaw to open from there. Of course, the jaw doesn't actually have a joint behind the ears and this will produce an effortful and potentially damaging movement. A website that offers resources about body mapping, BodyMap.org states, "Body mapping is the conscious correcting and refining of one's body map to produce efficient, graceful, coordinated, effective movement."

The concert on April 18th was held at Valmont church and featured a 50-member choir, three directors, three pianists and a string quartet! It was an evening of truly beautiful music that was focused on telling

the message of Easter. There was a broad range of selections performed including Mozart's "Ave Verum Corpus" and a unique arrangement of "The Old Rugged Cross." From the concert, we raised \$390.00 for Hospice Care of Broomfield and Boulder counties. The event offered a chance for choir members to broaden their fellowship and outreach and to learn from working with other conductors. We hope to hold another event like this one in the new future!
