The Spirit gives many gifts to the church so as to equip and support us in the ministry entrusted to us by Christ. Paul notes that these gifts vary in nature, but are all intended for our mutual-edification rather than as a means of lording power over one another. Paul never offers an exhaustive list of the Spirit's gifting, but he does tell

the Romans that the works of the church are to "be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer" (Romans 12:12). All of the spiritual gifts are to be exercised in faithful prayer.

Prayer is the lifeblood of the Christian life, as it re-attunes us to the Lord's will, directing us in how to partner with this will in our daily lives. Prayer opens us up to be changed; be conformed to God's desires for the world. This is why prayer is not a spiritual gift, but rather one of the essential tools for employing the gifts we've been given.

And with this in mind, I would like to invite you to join me in honing our prayer lives throughout the season of Lent. I know that we are still a couple months away from that preparatory season, but I wanted to give you all a heads -up for a Wednesday night

gathering that will be less of a class and more of a practice in the life of prayer. Each week, following choir rehearsal, you will be invited to join us in the sanctuary or online for an hour diving deep into God's hopes for your life. May we all be strengthened by this time together.

Pig Roasts and Potlucks



10-MINUTE OATMEAL BANANA PANCAKES From Homemade Mastery



INGREDIENTS

- * 2 tbsp yogurt, heaping tbsp * 1 cup oats 2 bananas * 2 eggs
- * 1 tsp vanilla or cinnamon (optional) * 1 tsp butter or coconut oil 1 tsp baking powder

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Use your food processor, blender or hand blender and a bowl to prepare the batter. Simply blend everything together until smooth.
- 2. Heat a large non-stick pan to medium, cover with butter/coconut oil and pour the batter forming small, palm-sized pancakes. Reduce the heat a bit (these burn fast if the temperature is too high!).
- 3. Once bubbles come up and the edges are done, flip using a large spatula. Cook until golden brown and then transfer to a plate.

Serve immediately like this or top with your favorite toppings - fresh fruit, maple syrup, peanut butter or honey and butter.

Pasta with Prosciutto (4-6 people) from Eric kitchen

- 1 lb. pasta of your choice
- * 2 egg yolks
- * 1 cup cream
- * 1/2 cup fresh-grated Parmesan

1/2 lemon zested

- * 1/2 orange zested
- * 4 oz. prosciutto
- * Salt & pepper

Combine egg yolks, cream, Parmesan, lemon & orange zest, salt, and pepper. After draining the cooked pasta, pour sauce and hot pasta into serving dish and mix. Add and mix prosciutto.



Delicious Baked Salmon Fillets—from Cindy's kitchen

Take a clean fillet, liberally spread brown sugar on top then sliced onion, then uncooked bacon and lastly fresh slices of lemon. Bake at 350 for at least 30 minutes and longer if the fillet is thick. I usually bake mine till the bacon is nice and crisp.



Breakfast Balls Recipe —from Stephen's kitchen

Ingredients

- 2 Cups rolled oats, uncooked
- * 1¹/₃ Cups Coconut Flakes
- * 1 Cup Flaxseed, ground

- 1 Cup Chocolate Chips (minis are best) * 2 Tbsp Chia seed

* 1 Cup Peanut Butter

²/₃ Cup Honey

* 2 tsp Vanilla

Preparation:

Mix, refrigerate until firm, roll into balls. Balls may be frozen for later. Place on a baking sheet. Freeze for a couple of hours, then store in an airtight container in freezer.

If you know of other improvement that needs to be addressed, please let me know.


* Wall repair and replace doors stops in sanctuary

Ray Rising – Ham Radio Operator, Repair, operations, new radio stations. Wycliff JAARS



Romans 10:14 – How shall they call on Him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in Him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach unless they are sent?

Ray Rising was a young man who after high school gave his life to Christ at a Billy Graham meeting. He had taken an electronic course. He heard that Wycliff had a group

who used Ham Radio in their work. They suggested he spend a year at bible school before checking again. He attended the Oak Hills Bible Institute where he met his wife, Doris. They applied to the Summer Institute in Linguistics and were accepted in 1965. After six weeks they went to 3 months of special training at the Jungle Aviation and Radio service and then three months of jungle training in Mexico.

For the next 10 years Ray and Doris worked at the SIL facility in Loma Linda, Columbia. He was involved in many interesting experiences with the Columbian people. Things seemed to be going fairly well even though the country was involved in civil difficulties.





After a furlough in the states, in 1983 they returned to the Loma Linda SIL facility for work among the local Columbian people.

On March 31, 1994 after breakfast with Doris he went to the local village of Puerto Lleras to interact with the people. He enjoyed giving the children rides on his motor bike. When he got back to the compound three Columbians with guns drawn started him on his 810 days in captivity in the jungle of Columbia.

During his captivity by the guerrilla faction he was treated as well as could be expected in a jungle. The captors were part of an insurgent army of a small group. This group had the task of keeping him safe and fed while they tried to extort money from anyone who cared, including SIL and family.

During his captivity he had many opportunities to share Christ's love to them. They were always fearful of being ambushed by the government troops. Always moving around making and breaking camps.

This story reminds me of Paul's time in the Roman prison and his ability to share Christ with his jailers.

Because of the guerrilla's fear of intelligence getting to the military, the story of his release is interesting in itself.

So where is Ray today. I got a message the other day he is back in Columbia setting up yet another radio station to share the Lord's message with the Columbia people in their own language.

I encourage you to read this book about his 810 days; <u>Guerrilla Hostage: 810 Days in Captivity by Denise Marie Siino</u> (goodreads.com).






Adult Education
